MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: **\$100,515**

INFANT: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$8,808**



Center-based: **\$14,110**

This is **9%-14%** of a family's income.

PRESCHOOLER: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$8,330**



Center-based: **\$11,106**

This is **8%-11%** of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: **\$15,348**
