IDHS Provider Compensation Contracts Survey

Starting in October 2024, IDHS is launching Child Care Workforce Compensation Contracts, which will provide stable, ongoing funding for qualifying child care providers to increase child care worker wages. IDHS is conducting a provider survey to ensure that the contract awards consider the real, current costs that providers face. The results of the survey will be used to inform award amounts.

The survey gathers information about staffing, benefits, rent/mortgage, and other expenses, which will be used to estimate the typical cost of providing child care in Illinois. It supplements the information that was recently gathered on the Salary and Staffing Survey. Unlike the Market Rate Survey, it collects information on providers' actual costs, not the tuition or fees that they charge.

The deadline to complete the survey is August 31, 2023. Providers can access the survey through these links:

Smart Start Transition Grants



The first round of the Smart Start Transition Grants is closed. However, applications for the second round will open on October 2, 2023, and will go until October 31, 2023. These grants are administered by INCCRRA and will transition licensed child care programs from the Strengthen and Grow Child Care grants to Smart Start Child Care in the future. Smart Start Transition Grants focus on providing stable and predictable funding in order to improve quality and support workforce development.

Every year, the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) holds several hearings in October to help shape its budget request for the coming fiscal year and hear from advocates across the state to identify funding needs in higher education, K-12, and early childhood education and care programming in Illinois. • Protect Federal Funds that Support Early Childhood Systems Building in Illinois

We need you to take action today to help ensure the <u>Preschool Development Grant Birth through Five (PDG B-5) program</u> stays funded through federal FY 2024! The PDG B-5 program is a \$315 million competitive federal grant designed to improve states' early childhood systems by building upon existing federal, state and local early learning and care investments.

is the time to call or email your congressional staff to ask them to protect and prioritize the PDG B-5 program before it is eliminated!

• Protect Head Start & Early Head Start Federal Funding

Currently, the proposed FY 2024 budget cuts funding for Head Start (HS) & Early Head Start (EHS) by \$750 million from the previous year and puts the care of 80,000 children at risk who currently use HS or EHS nationwide. This has a significant impact on critical services for children and families, and we need you to tell Congress not to cut Head Start Funding in FY24!

Take two minutes to email your members of Congress asking them to oppose cuts to Head Start that would harm the children and families we serve.

ECACE Scholarship Applications Open Now

The priority deadline for applications has passed, but ECACE is still taking applications depending on available funding!

If you work or have worked in early childhood education and you're seeking additional credentials and/or a degree in early childhood education, you may be eligible for the Early Childhood Access Consortium for Equity (ECACE) Scholarship Program. ECACE scholarships are available for people with degrees or credentials in early childhood education and may cover partial or the total cost of attendance after other financial aid is received. Note: costs include tuition and fees, transportation, room and board, and books and supplies. The scholarship program has been expanded to participants who are also seeking post-bachelorette degrees or credentials.

In the News: ECACE report shows that more early childhood workers are attending colleges and universities

On August 23, the Illinois Early Childhood Access Consortium for Equity released its first <u>annual report</u> and found that since 2020 about 500 additional students who already work in early childhood education have enrolled in bachelor's degree and applied associate programs, an increase of about 18%. The report also found an increase in the number of Latino and African American child care professionals who enrolled in college since 2020. Read more in the article <u>here</u>

In particular, the report looks at the effect of the pandemic on child care slots within Cook County regions, the affordability of care, and trends related to some of the hardest-to-find care – including infant care and care during non-traditional hours.
